

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Healthy teeth, happy smiles!



In an effort to encourage good oral health habits from the earliest age, the EYFS framework includes the requirement for nurseries to promote oral health from September 2021. Tooth decay is largely preventable, but is a serious problem among young children. Nearly a quarter of 5 year olds in England have tooth decay, with 3 or 4 teeth affected on average. Tooth extraction is one of the most common procedures for children under 6 in hospital. Figures suggest that more than 105 children a day have their teeth removed in hospital due to tooth decay.

At Leapfrog, self-care, healthy eating and physical development have been included in our routines using stories linked to brushing teeth, going to the dentist and healthy eating - which we are happy to lend to you. Children will also be practising teeth cleaning using model teeth and tooth brushing kits.

In light of this new requirement we will also cover oral health in our parent telephone consultations, along with general health discussions such as eating, sleep routines and behaviour. You may also find the [Public Health England: health matters, child dental health](#) document of interest as it includes tips, links and guidance to help prevent tooth decay in the under 5's. Colgate's [Bright Smiles Bright Futures](#) website also contains a wealth of information.

The children would love a visit in the setting from any parents who are dental nurses or dentists. If you're able to spend some time sharing your knowledge with them to support this learning please contact the office - we'd love to hear from you.

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Changes to EYFS

You may already be aware of the recent changes made to the EYFS this September 2021. The new framework acknowledges that children develop and learn at different rates and in different ways so one of the first things you will notice is that your child's tapestry account will no longer include statements and age bands. Instead, these will be replaced by the broader bands 'Birth to Three' and 'Three and Four Year Olds'.



At Leapfrog our curriculum continues to recognise the uniqueness of each child, and is designed to help every child achieve their full potential by meeting their interests, accounting for appropriate developmental stages and to channel their individual abilities. Our curriculum meets the requirements of the educational programmes in the statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

As a base for our curriculum we use the Department for Education non statutory curriculum guidance 'Development Matters'. The department of Education has also produced an updated '[What to expect when](#)' guide for parents. We think you will find this document much more useful than the previous document as it provides a comprehensive view of stages of development and how children learn as well as being packed full of great ideas to support learning at home with useful checkpoints.

We will be introducing focus weeks for our children with each child becoming the focus child once per term. During each child's focus week parents will have the opportunity to contribute and consult with us in a structured way each term. During each child's focus week they will noticeably have more observations in their journals on which quality interactions and learning experiences are recorded. We hope to have this fully in place across the nursery by January 2022.

Nursery Outings Volunteers Needed

To support our curriculum with enhanced experiences we would love to take 2-3 and pre school children out and about to explore their local environment. In order for us to do this safely we will require parent volunteers to help us.

If you are able to spare a couple of hours once a term please could you drop us an email with available days or dates so that we can start to plan for these events.

Should the date that you can offer doesn't coincide with your child's usual booking, they can of course come along with you.

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Parent Nursery Events

If you've been with us a while you'll know how much we value the importance of partnership with parents. Our regular parent events including workshops, are a great opportunity for us to get to know each other better and to work together in supporting your child's learning. So we are delighted to be able to begin to reintroduce these this term and hope you can join us.

Christmas Parties and NEW! Stay & Play Sessions

Due to Covid we have made the decision this year to limit our Christmas parties to children only. We realise this might be disappointing for those who have experienced our parties in the past. The good news is that you won't miss out on the party activities as we are introducing a week of new stay and play sessions for each room (subject to Covid restrictions), where parents are invited to come and join in on the fun.

This is a lovely chance for you to see a snippet of what we get up to at nursery as well as engaging in some fun activities with your children. If your child does not attend on the day of these sessions you are of course, welcome to attend together.

Understanding Young Children's Behaviour Parent Workshop

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
Birth-3



Important information—please read

Bringing items into nursery

Please could we remind parents to make sure that your children do not bring any toys in from home, other than dummies or comforters (which will be used at sleep times and then put straight back in the child's bag). Please could we also ask that comforters be washed regularly.

We cannot take responsibility for any toys that are lost or damaged.

Food

It is important that parents do not allow their children to bring food into the nursery. If they have had a snack en route to nursery please ensure they have finished it before entering the nursery building. We have numerous children with allergies and some severe, which could result in serious illness if another child was to find these items.

Arrivals and Collection

Arrival time is now flexible if you want to drop your child in their room please arrive between 8:00-8:45am or 1:00-1:15pm

Please vacate the room by 8:45am/1:15pm

After 8:45am/1:15pm a member of staff will collect your child from the main door.

Collections include pick up at 4:00, 4:30, 5:00, 5:30 and anytime up to 6pm. Please continue to advise of planned pick up time on arrival.
