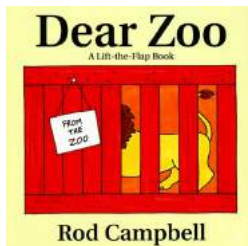
We are looking forward to our annual Barnardo's toddle which will be held this Summer. Details will follow nearer the time.

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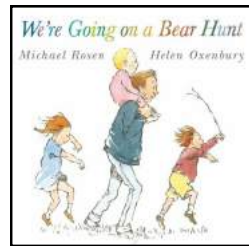

We can't wait for World Book Day when children are invited to dress up as their favourite book character and their rooms will be themed with story related activities throughout the week of the 27th February.



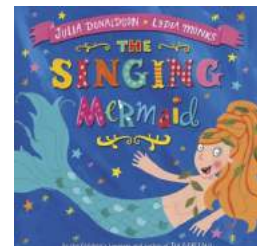
Toddlers

On Thursday 2nd March we are hosting our first Book Day Stay and Play sessions where you are invited to come into the nursery and see first hand how fun activities, inspired by stories, further support your child's language and communication development. Master Mathematician (Over 3's) Parent Workshop

This fun, practical hands-on workshop has been designed for parents of pre-school aged children. Come along and join the pre-school team who will introduce the terminology used in early years maths. The workshop will also provide you with the opportunity to try out some of the activities that support children's early mathematical development around counting sets, number words and numerals. We will introduce you to the skills children need to be able to master maths, potential difficulties they might encounter and how to help with these.

Mother's Day Events

To celebrate Mother's Day the children would like to invite their Mummy's to a fun event at the Nursery. Events will be held from the 13-18th March with different events being hosted in each room including a toddler's teddy bear's picnic, 2-3's creative sensory and a pre-school mother's day café. 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Toddler Room

Our toddlers do love a good rhyme! This term we have been enjoying a variety of different rhymes, introducing nouns and verbs to the children supporting their vocabulary development. They've particularly enjoyed discovering all things shiny and joining together with 'twinkle, twinkle' with additional activities introducing key words from the song such as 'star' and 'up'.



Other favourites such as 'Head, shoulders, knees and toes' and 'If you're happy and you know it' will be joining their repertoire soon introducing body part nouns and verbs in terms of the actions they can make with their bodies.

Rhymes are just one of the ways we are supporting your child's communication and literacy development. Most babies and toddlers learn nouns first ie people's names, places and objects. This is followed by the addition of verbs such as jump, clap, stamp, run. With this extended vocabulary children will then begin to construct short phrases together by putting two words together.

Next term we'll be holding a workshop for parents who want to discover more about the stages of young children's language development along with tips and techniques to help support and encourage your child as they learn whilst having fun together.

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Two-Three Room

With World Book Day approaching this term, we thought it would be nice to share with you how we will be developing young children's communication and literacy.

With a focus on early mathematical language and counting including size and number, children have recently been exploring a selection of different bear themed areas.

Based on bear related books, the children have delighted in re-enacting the stories they've shared engaging in some fun activities together. From posting letters in the post box just like postman bear to feeding their bears porridge, just like Goldilocks, and holding their own teddy bears picnic they've had a fantastic time.

Here's a glimpse into what they've been up to and what they've been able to tell us about their experiences



*'Baby bear has a little bowl. Where's the little spoon?'
'I've got two spoons - one for mummy bear and one for daddy'
'This is daddy's bowl- he's got a big one'
'I'm sitting on mummy bear's chair - it's a bit small*

We'll continue the theme for World Book Day with the story 'Going on a bear hunt' and you're invited to join us! Come along to our stay and play on the 2nd March when we will be acting out the story and sharing with you how we use stories such as these to introduce early mathematical positional vocabulary in an encouraging and engaging way.

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Pre-School Room

With World Book Day approaching we thought it would be nice to share some of the activities your children are enjoying as they develop their communication and literacy.

Over the last few weeks children have been engrossed in transforming their themed book area into a superhero base camp. Prompted by how and why open-ended questions children are given the opportunity to try, fail, hypothesise, experiment and succeed on their own.

Your super heroes would be delighted if you wanted to visit their basecamp at drop-off. In the meantime, here are some of the fantastic results we've seen so far, including some great mark making and designing.



*'We need to draw around our hands.
Hand means STOP! Don't come in!'*

*'If we teach the baddies how to be nice,
they have to see the rules.
They can go on the door.
No pushing, no biting, no hitting.
Only Cuddles'*



*'We need to use tape. Then the boxes will
stay together. Glue isn't strong enough'*

*'Spiderman has a web. Let's put the web
everywhere to keep the baddies out'*

During the term children will also be presented with some exciting science challenges to solve. Together with their friends they'll be faced with HOW to rescue our superheroes if they get trapped in ice and how making an ice trap could help catch the baddies. We'll also be employing super hero powers as we explore WHY some objects sink whilst others float, whether the tallest pre-schooler can jump the furthest and whether the oldest child is also the tallest.

With lots of opportunities for plenty of experimentation, trial and error this term we are sure the children will have ideas to test out at home with you too!

Outdoor clothing

Labelling
