Families and Leapfrog Learning Together

Staff Team Training

Staff enthusiastically developed their knowledge of how music can support development in communication, language, expressive arts, creativity, self-expression and early reading. Helen Mead from Portsmouth Music Hub joined our latest staff training to share a new initiative to support teaching and learning in Early Years settings, aligned with the aims of the National Plan for Music Education.



As we implement 'musicing around' in the nursery we will be sharing some new resources with the children. We have some shiny new chime bars and noisy shaky eggs as well as lycra and stretchy bungee ropes to use as we sing some new songs together.

Our second staff session covered how to support young children's behaviour in parallel with the parent workshop delivered last term. Providing useful insight into why children react the way they do, this workshop explored a variety of ideas and strategies to help support children in dealing with their emotions confidently during difficult moments.

We received fantastic feedback from both staff, parents and some parents who missed the session have requested we re-run it again. To help us gauge interest and arrange dates accordingly, please let us know if you would be interested.

Family Assist

As part of our collaboration with parents, we frequently share resources to assist our families. This term we are introducing a new initiative managed and delivered by the Healthy Child Programme at Solent NHS Trust.

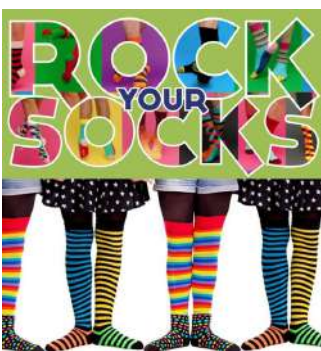


Families across Portsmouth and Southampton cities and the Isle of Wight can now benefit from this free, comprehensive, easy to access service from their local health professionals, providing information up to the age of 3, with more guidance for older children already in development.

The digital portal can be accessed at any time, from a phone, tablet or PC and will deliver key pieces of information by e-mail to registered users at the relevant stages throughout pregnancy and the different stages of a child's life.

They can also connect with local professionals to ask a question and receive an email response within two working days so families can receive timely, reliable and relevant information. Parents and carers can also invite their relatives and friends to join them so that they can receive the same information and ask questions. This is a great way to include partners who can sometimes feel like they aren't included in the parenting journey.

How to sign up to Family Assist Anyone can sign up to Family Assist by visiting the portal and [creating an account](#). Once an account has been created, users will be guided through an online form where they will be asked for some key information about their pregnancy, if they are expecting a baby, or their child if they have already been born. This information will form your 'Pathway Record' which will be used to ensure you receive the key information that your local health teams would like for you to see, at the time it is relevant and important.



On the 21st March in support of one of our nursery children, staff and children wore their craziest, funkiest socks to nursery as we joined in with the Portsmouth Down Syndrome Associate's 'Rock Your Socks' campaign to increase public awareness and end the stereotypes often linked with people who have Down's Syndrome. We were delighted to be able to join in as it was lovely to see all the odd socks and bright coloured socks that the children wore on the day!

Toddler Room

It's been a busy few months in our Toddler room with the introduction of fresh, Spring and Easter themed activities. Children have shown lots of interest in the 'That's not my lamb' and 'That's not my bunny' books. They have particularly enjoyed exploring the different textures in the book with their fingers and suspense when turning each new page. They have been excitedly joining in with 'Old Macdonald' animal noises and matching toys with the animals in the book. Some children have also delighted in using related first words including 'E-I-E-I-O' as we sing together.



In the coming weeks we'll be building on the toddlers' recent interest in textures as they 'get messy' developing fine motor skills with sensory experiences using mashed potato and cooked spaghetti. The messy play continues as our budding bakers also use their fine motor skills to ice, pick up and place items as they decorate biscuits (and have a little nibble!). We're looking forward to seeing wonderful creations!

Anticipate lots of giggling and glee as toddlers crawl through, over and around their new tents and tunnels in the room. These amazing athletes will be getting physical, developing their gross motor skills, coordination and body awareness with activities indoors and out. In addition to our own movement we're also enjoying discovering movement of vehicles supported by nursery rhymes such as 'Row, Row, Row your boat' and 'Wheels on the bus' and the story 'Zoom, Zoom'.

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Two-Three Room

With Easter approaching, children enjoyed activities relating to our focus story 'Going on an egg hunt' book. We loved acting out the story with our friends as we found the eggs and collected them in our baskets.

Making tasty chocolate nests was also a big hit as children were able to develop their hand to eye co-ordination along with fine motor skills breaking up chocolate, stirring the ingredients together and scooping spoonfuls of mixture into cake cases.

We were delighted with our marble eggs which we created by rolling painted marbles over our eggs. This was a fun way to create a pretty effect whilst developing our shoulder and elbow pivot movements used in early mark making.



This term children have experienced more activities linked to our Budding Baker curriculum goal starting with jam tarts where children have enjoyed using different utensils to roll, press, cut and spoon jam into their tart cases. Perfect for a picnic, just like the teddy bears in our new focus book 'Teddy Bear's Picnic'.

Building on the children's recent interest in 'Going on an egg hunt' we are bringing 'Going on a bear hunt' to life this term. They will be able to discover the bear cave in our role play area and have fun acting out the story together. We will have lots of other related activities where we'll be joining in with it's well known repeated phrases supporting children's communication and introducing positional language.

As the weather warms up, we're looking forward to taking our role play outdoors with bear hunts, snack time picnics and story time in the garden. Following on from the children's interest in the 'Hungry Caterpillar' we are eager to watch our own caterpillars growing before releasing the butterflies in our wild area outside.

The 'big garden' is always an exciting place for the children with lots of space to play with friends and we are excited to be able to spend more time outside climbing, sliding, cycling, running and enjoying accessories such as hoops and balls together.

Pre-School Room

We were thrilled to welcome parents to our World Book Day 'Stay and Play' event this term with activities inspired by the '[Little People, Big Dreams](#)' biographies. We enjoyed practicing the skills of scientists, activists, creatives and political figures including colour mixing, creating perfume, making junk model musical instruments, fabric paint designing as well as making erupting volcanos and exploding film cannisters!



Older pre-school children continued their science exploration with a 'journey through space' at The Portsmouth Academy. A huge thank you to Millie's mum for inviting us to the science show during British Science Week - we loved the solar system and rocket launches!



We ended the term celebrating the Easter festival with related activities such as experiencing the reversible state of chocolate whilst making tasty Easter nests. We also hopped around an egg hunt, following maps to find stickers and treats left for us by the Easter Bunny!

This week Shanice, our Deputy Team Leader, will be telling us about another Spring festival, Eid. We'll be dressing up in traditional clothing, doing henna art and making some delicious Samosas.

An active Summer is planned focusing on physical activity and growth learning about fascinating mini-beasts using our wormeries, related books and raising and feeding our own caterpillars. Our own physical activity will come into it's own as we focus on our Amazing Athlete curriculum goal with an Olympic theme. Inspired by the 2024 games and the book '[The Frog Olympics](#)' we will be practicing our sporting skills to develop our gross motor skills with our own rabbit-worthy Leapfrog Olympics and learn more about the health benefits physical activities can bring us all.

Important information - please read

Sun cream

In warmer weather please ensure that 24 hour sun cream is applied before attending nursery. ** Due to a known nut allergy issue please avoid Nivea Sun protection range for kids.

Summer clothing

Replace wooly hats for sunhat, along with spare clothes (including welly boots) for wet play.

Water bottles

Children in our 2-3 room and pre-school rooms should be provided with a clearly labelled water bottle.

Labelling

Please can you ensure that all of your child's clothing and accessories (including hats, wellies and shoes) are clearly labelled and please check lost property frequently.

Bringing items into nursery

Please do not bring toys in from home (other than dummies or comforters, which will be used at sleep times and then put straight back in the child's bag).

Arrivals and Collection

Children can be accompanied into their room between 8:00-8:45am/1:00-1:15pm. After 8:45am/1:15pm a member of staff will collect your child from the main door.

Morning sessions start at 8:45am so please ensure you have vacated and do not enter the room after this time.

Collections include pick up at 4:00, 4:30, 5:00, 5:30 and anytime up to 6:00pm.

Please continue to advise of planned pick up time on arrival.

Handovers on collection provide a brief summary of the child's day.

To avoid delays to parents and to ensure staff can support children still in nursery, please book a separate appointment for any in-depth discussions as required.
