## Families and Leapfrog Learning Together



It is well known that connecting with nature boost children's physical, social and mental development. And it's lots of fun too. Feeling a snail's smooth shell, digging and mixing mud and splashing water. It is moments like these that help children grow and connect with nature and the natural world.

Throughout the nursery day our practitioners use their knowledge to ensure that every opportunity is used to encourage your child's connection with nature in fun and engaging ways to support their development within the nursery

curriculum. Taking inspiration from the 'National Trust's 50 things to do before you're 11<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>', staff planned seasonal experiences for children to explore and enjoy nature in our outdoor spaces. Helping children become planet protectors, they build an awareness of different environments, habitats and living things and through this, are learning how to look after nature.

As revealed in a study commissioned by the National Trust, nature language is being overtaken by uses referring to digital technology, especially among younger generations. Words such as tweet, web, stream, cloud being related to messaging, data and online media rather than birds, spiders, rivers and skies. To combat this, as children become skillful communicators, activities have been carefully designed to encourage children's use of language for the natural world.

We hope that by engaging children in nature during this early age of fascination and wonder, they will continue to discover and explore it far beyond their early years.

## Babies and Toddler Room

This summer the toddlers have been actively exploring the outdoors environment including exploring nature in our garden and visiting Victoria Park. The children used their gross motor movements to splash in muddy puddles and play in the park.

As babies grow, they move beyond being content to simply feel and ponder objects, wanting to find out what can be done with them with an appetite to handle things: to fill, empty, stack, knock down, select and manipulate in different ways.

To satisfy their growing curiosity and development. Toddlers have been engrossed in exploring a range of everyday objects for themselves. Without intervention they have wandered, touched and explored items such as shells, tins, dolly pegs, shiny materials, fabrics, pots, beads, wooden rings and tubes.







This form of learning is referred to as 'Heuristic' play and is rooted in young children's natural curiosity. It's a fabulous way of supporting children's concentration, creativity, problem solving alongside developing gross motor skills.

For example, during play things may not go to plan; children may try to post something that is too big into a box, they might try to roll something that simply can't roll. They will learn about physical properties of objects and also learn how to formulate solutions through trial and error.

#### Over 2's Room

We have had a wonderfully fun summer with children in the over 2's room exploring different nurturing nature activities, including mud play, Hapa Zome (transferring natural dyes from flowers on to fabric using hammers), perfume making and flower crowns. Alongside this the children loved exploring their interest in dinosaurs, creating their own fossils, making dinosaur eggs and playing in the dinosaur museum they created.







#### 2-3's

As we start the autumn term we wanted to share with you some of the communication activities that we have planned which also link to the mathematical concept of positional language. Using 'in, under, on and up' we will be joining in together singing songs such as '5 little monkeys jumping on the bed' and 'Dingle Dangle scarecrow'. Our focus stories this term will be the different books from 'Tales of Acorn Wood'. We will be learning about the different forest animals. We are sure your children will be eager to tell you about 'Rabbits Nap', 'Fox and Socks' and 'Postman Bear' which we will be sharing with them through exciting linked activities.

## Pre-school

With the end of the summer children have been talking about visiting different beaches and parks so we have started the term reading Shark in the Park, encouraging children's early literature skills through listening to the story, waiting for the prompt before the children join in with the repeated phrase.



As Autumn approaches we are continuing with the nature themed activities the children took part in over the summer and, linked to our planet protector, we will be exploring seasonal changes including how and why some animals hibernate during the winter and what we can do to help by making bird feeders.

The children have been developing their listening and attention skills linked to early phonics by exploring and tuning in to instrumental sounds. They have liked exploring different instruments and how we can play them to make long, short, quiet and loud sounds. The children will be extending their early phonics skills by linking instruments to 'The Gruffalo' story where they can represent the different characters through music.

To discover more about phonological awareness in the early years and how to support your child, please join us for our parent workshop: Phase 1 Letters and Sounds for over 3's being held on **Wednesday 13th November from 6:45-8:30pm**.

We can't wait to unveil our 'Gruffalo café' where children will have the opportunity to develop their skills with one handed tools as they prepare 'Scrambled Snake' 'Owl ice-cream' and 'Roasted Fox'. The highlight, no doubt, will be the classic 'Gruffalo crumble' when children will make their own apple crumble, where they can put the skills they've developed to good (and tasty!) use.

One of children's favorite activities at the start of the term has been using our new light sabers to develop strength co-ordination and control in their arms as part of the early stages of getting ready to write.

## Important information - please read

## Weather appropriate clothing

So that your child can enjoy the garden in comfort during the cooler and wetter months, please ensure your child brings a pair of wellington boots and suitable for outdoor wear including coats, hats, scarves and gloves when appropriate.

## Labelling

To avoid items being lost, please can you ensure that all of your child's clothing and accessories (including hats, wellies and shoes) are clearly labelled and please check lost property frequently.

#### Water bottles

Children in our 2-3 and pre-school rooms should be provided with a clearly labelled water bottle.

## **Bringing items into nursery**

Please could we remind parents to make sure that your children do not bring any toys in from home, other than dummies or comforters (which will be used at sleep times and then put straight back in the child's bag).

#### **Arrivals and collection**

To accompany your child into their room please arrive between 8:00-8:45am or 1:00-1:15pm and vacate the room by 8:45am/1:15pm

After 8:45am/1:15pm a member of staff will collect your child from the main door.

Collections include pick up at 4:00, 4:30, 5:00, 5:30 and anytime up to 6:00pm. Please continue to advise of planned pick up time on arrival.
